

Dr. Cecile Memorial

Cécile was the friend of Jesus of Nazareth, the Christian -- the mistress of non-violence, social peace, equity. Cecile was the visionary, the voice of the voiceless, the MISSIONARY IMPOSSIBLE.

She was the smiling shepherdess and mother of the vulnerable. Cecile could have come from another world, not only spiritually, but because she was always at the service of others. She gave her blood for transfusions of children almost every quarter until a very advanced age of her life.

Cecile embodied wisdom, intelligence, simplicity, way of being, passion for the vulnerable.

Cécile brought joy to the vulnerable and was the consoler with the practical answer to problems. She was very rich in thought and good material, but chose the life of the vulnerable, leaving a decent house of the mission to stay with the vulnerable almost in the same conditions as themselves and be at their service day and night in the same village and in neighboring room for some.

Cecil turned the vulnerable into responsible people, pagans into Christians, poor into rich.

For Cecile, preaching Jesus and living the life of Jesus were two different but approaching things. Cecile through her ministry lived the life of Jesus Christ. She pulled me like David from the crowd that surrounded her, initiated me to live the life of prayers, to love the service of the vulnerable, orphans, widows, widowers and patients. She had the saying that we must LISTEN - REFLECT - ACT RAPIDLY TO SAVE LIFE.

The biblical passages of a practical teaching model came from the book of Isaiah chapter 58 from the 6th to the 12th verse and Matthew chapter 25 from the 30th to the 40th verse. Cécile officially adopted 35 children, all vulnerable and transformed into gentlemen and ladies across the world and me the 36th small villager and youngest son, today transformed into a gentleman and also a doctor and executive director of Butoke, who now has taken the baton in his hands for the continuing of the works of God and Jesus Christ through the special messenger Cécile Desweemer.

Yes, we miss her. Cecile will live through her works, I think of the work of the vulnerable who are our inheritance (us, you and the others).
